

2021 Convening Support Grant Application

Thank you for your interest in Common Field's 2021 Convening Support Grant Program. This year, Common Field will distribute 60 support grants for the Convening. Support Grant recipients will receive **\$250 in unrestricted funds, free registration to this year's Convening and a free one-year membership to Common Field.**

Our Support Grant program is meant to support those who would not be able to attend the Convening without financial assistance, and who plan to be able to participate in at least 2 days of the Convening.

The 2021 Convening will offer all registrants the option of paying between \$5 and \$50 for a ticket as part of a sliding scale pay structure. If you feel you can support your attendance with paid registration at any level, we encourage you to register in September through our ticketing system and allow those who need additional financial support to attend to apply for these support grant funds. No one will be turned away from the Convening for lack of funds.

Support grants are meant to support any essential financial costs that may otherwise be prohibitive to your attendance this year. This can include childcare costs, lost wages (freelance, contractor), purchase of small technical equipment like cameras or mobile hotspots to facilitate online attendance, or other costs you may identify in this application.

All support grant applications will be reviewed by a jury of field professionals assessing demonstration of need, impact of funds for applicants, and desired outcomes for attending and participating. The jury will also prioritize first-time attendees and members of underserved communities within Common Field, including those who identify as living in rural communities, low-income, part of the LGBTQI+ or BIPOC communities, independent cultural workers, caregivers, emerging professionals, and people with disabilities. The jury will take into consideration any significant impacts from COVID-19 over the last 18 months applicants may share.

All support grant applicants will be notified of their status by **September 14, 2021**. Awardees will not be asked to report on how funds were used.
